Grand Knight's Report

A Great Day to be a Knight

July 20th 2018, was a great day to be a member of one of the Greensboro's Knights of Columbus Councils. Why? Because on that day the following Greensboro Council's; Piedmont Council 939, St. Mary's Council 8684, St. Pius X Council. 11101 and St. Paul's Council 13236 met with Dr. LaToy Kennedy, Principal of Hampton Elementary University Magnet School and Director of the Hampton Community Relief Fund. They presented her with a check totaling \$8000.00 to assist the community providing basic needs to the affected families in the damaged area.

This is the story of how it all came together. First there was a terrible storm that hit the Eastern part of Guilford County on April 15th. In the following

weeks, local Knights volunteered their time and energy to cut down trees and help with the clean-up. A request was made and provided for replacement backpacks and non-perishable snacks to students who had lost them in local damage. Again we Knights responded. The local Greensboro Councils provided 25 backpacks to this cause. Next at the Knights of Columbus State meeting in May, we were made aware of a surplus of in the State Funds for Disaster Relief. John Joyce (our District Deputy) and I started a conversation with the other Grand Knights in Greensboro about requesting funds to aid in the recovery of this devastated area. With John spear heading the efforts, the local Councils were able to secure \$8,000 of Relief Funds for this worthy cause. All of this leads to the July 20th. That day

the four Greensboro Councils formally presented Dr. LaToy Kennedy with the \$8,000 check.

This is truly the reason why we are Knights of Columbus. This single act of Charity, securing money that will be distributed directing to those who were the most affected by the storm. Knowing that our efforts are going to help people when they are most in need, gives me the hope and conviction that what we do as Knights is greater than ourselves. When meeting run little long or other events do not pan out as planned, we can remember July 20th and know that we are capable of doing more to help those in need. I would like to thank John Joyce, Walter Kulla and the North Carolina State Officers who helped make this happen.

Greensboro K of C Councils Unite to Assist Area Tornado Victims

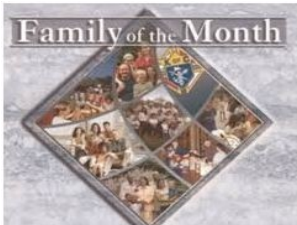

Answer: It will affect your Fraternal Benefits.....

Each member of the Knights has a small accidental death life policy that is included in your dues. Keep your dues current and the policy remains active.

Agent Reference Guide – Fraternal Benefits Page 6
2016-01-01 Knights of Columbus

Years of Continuous Membership Benefit

If death results prior to age 65, this benefit payable is based on the member's years of continuous membership in good standing.

- Less than two years \$1,000
- Two years, but less than three \$1,500
- Three years, but less than four \$2,000
- Four years or more \$2,500

The benefit amount will be reduced by \$500 on the member's 65th birthday and each subsequent birthday, until the benefit amount is stabilized at \$1,000. The \$1,000 coverage will continue thereafter, provided the member and the member's council are in good standing and both so reflected on the records of the Supreme Council.

The spouse benefit at all times corresponds to the member's benefit. At no time will the spouse benefit exceed the member's benefit. Should the member predecease his wife, she shall continue to be covered thereafter at a fixed benefit of \$1,000, provided this benefit remains in effect. Should the spouse and the member die within 90 days from the same accident, however, the scheduled benefit will be paid.
