District Deputy Note

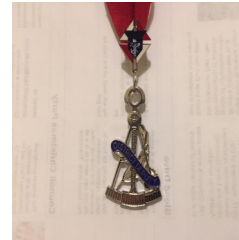

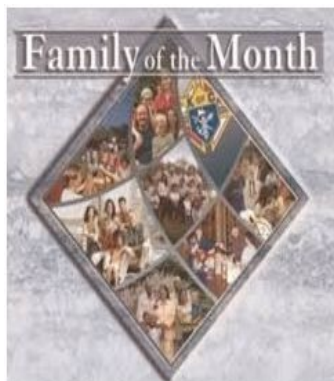
On February 19 at 6:30PM, our District will host a Forma-
