Do We Know How to Pray (Christopher Mierez)

In 1982, Mary appeared to a visionary named Valentine in Kibeho, Rwanda and asked her to teach all her earthly children how to pray. Here is a condensed version of what she said.

"My children, there are many who want to pray, who try to pray, but do not know how to pray. Listen to my words, for I will teach you how to pray from the bottom of your hearts. God sees your every action and knows your every thought; you can hide nothing from him. But you must tell him yourself.

First; you must ask for God's forgiveness from the bottom of your heart. Rest as-

sured that if you confess and seek forgiveness, sincerely. He will forgive you.

Then, my children, you too must offer for-giveness by asking God to forgive all those who have trespassed against you, all who have caused you suffering or given you insult or injury. Forgive them in prayer and ask God to bless and help them.

Then, pray for the spiritual and physical welfare of your relatives, for all your brothers and sisters, that God may bless them.

Most important, you must ask God for the strength not to stray from his light. And never forget, my chil-

dren to pray for the strength to be humble. Your prayers have no meaning if they do not come from the depths of your heart. Then, give thanks for all the favors he has granted you.

Pray to him fervently, make a petition, beg his favor, ask for his blessing; God sees into your soul and knows you seek his help with a repentant heart.

Finally, when you lack the strength to pray, ask for my help. Pray for my intercession, and I will strengthen you and bring you to my son and to the Father through your prayer."

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family? Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own? Maybe they did not know to whom to turn?

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's financial future; planning, life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs.
